

THE ORCHESTRE SYMPHONIQUE DE MONTRÉAL CELEBRATES ITS 90th SEASON!

Montreal, January 16, 2024 – Since its foundation 90 years ago by Antonia Nantel, Wilfrid Pelletier and Athanase David, the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal (OSM) has seen generations of musicians and guest soloists brilliantly contribute to its renown and excellence since 1934. As the Montreal institution embarks on a major anniversary year, here's an overview of the highlights of its 90 seasons, and an invitation to discover its great history.

Tonight, before Rafael Payare conducts Mahler's Symphony No. 7, the OSM invites you into the foyers of the Maison symphonique to discover never-before-seen artifacts and archives, while an exhibition celebrating the 90-year history of the Orchestra is presented. A great opportunity for spectators to recall fond memories and learn more about their orchestra's defining moments. To keep the celebration going, 90 gifts have been hidden under the seats: season tickets, special tickets, discounts, OSM recordings, a tour of the organ and even a post-concert meet-and-greet with Rafael Payare. This anniversary evening, organized by the Orchestra to thank its audiences for their loyalty over the past nine decades, promises to be a memorable one!



FROM WILFRID PELLETIER TO RAFAEL PAYARE

To date, the OSM has been led by nine Music Directors, from cofounder **Wilfrid Pelletier** to the present day's **Rafael Payare**. Six Chief Executive Officers have been at the helm of the Orchestra since its inception, including **Madeleine Careau**, who currently heads a predominantly female management team. Three maestros have been named Conductors Emeriti: **Wilfrid Pelletier**, **Zubin Mehta**, and **Kent Nagano**, while **Olivier Latry** is Organist Emeritus and **Pierre Béique**, General Manager Emeritus.

A FEW KEY DATES IN THE OSM'S OUTSTANDING HISTORY...

1935 / Launch of the "Matinées symphoniques pour la jeunesse," youth concerts reflecting the importance of education at the heart of the OSM's mission from the beginning;

1938 / A long tradition is born: free concerts at the Chalet atop Mount Royal;

1940 / Inauguration of the Prix Archambault, the OSM Competition's direct forerunner whose 84th edition took place in November 2023;

1954 / The Concerts symphoniques de Montréal is renamed Orchestre symphonique de Montréal;

1962 / First international tour under Zubin Mehta;

1963 / Inauguration de la Grande salle de la Place des arts;

1980 / First OSM recording conducted by Charles Dutoit;

2011 / Inauguration of the Maison symphonique de Montréal, the OSM's home concert hall;

2014 / Inauguration of the Grand Orgue Pierre-Béique thanks to Jacqueline Desmarais who assumed all costs for the instrument;

2016 / Launch of the program La musique aux enfants, an initiative of Kent Nagano;

2022-2023 / The OSM embarks on three international tours to South Korea, major European capitals, and the USA, including the Orchestra's 45th appearance at the prestigious Carnegie Hall.

SOME OSM STATISTICS

Today, this Orchestra of 92 accomplished musicians performs more than one hundred concerts per year, has produced 141 recordings earning more than 118 national and international awards, embarked on 58 international tours, and played in many of the most distinguished halls throughout Europe, North America, South America, Asia, not to mention Nunavik and Quebec's Far North.
